## LITURGY

Listen graciously to the prayers of this family, whom you have summoned before you: in your compassion, O merciful Father, gather to yourself all your children scattered throughout the world.

### Eucharistic Prayer III

Prepare for the **6th Sunday in Ordinary Time**--Lv 13:1-2,44-46; Ps 32:1-2,5,11; 1 Cor 10:31-11:1; Mk 1:40-45: In Jesus time, leprosy was considered a punishment for sins involving speech or language, such as gossip and slander. Since it was thought that persons with leprosy could contaminate others, they were separated from the community for the good of all. We sometimes feel as if we are being punished for our sins. Separated from family and friends, work and worship, we feel like the living dead. Somehow we get the courage to reach out to Jesus, begging like a leper: "If you will to do so, you can cure me!" Then we feel the touch of Jesus and hear him saying, "I do will it. Be cured!" How can we restrain ourselves from telling everyone we meet of the mighty deeds of God? Paul insisted that everything should be done for the glory of God. Our call is given not for our own sake but for the sake of others. A Christian must be a good example to everyone, especially to the church of God, but even to our enemies. We cannot accomplish this by our own power. We have God's grace to help us imitate Christ in all we do and say.

*For Reflection: Do I pollute my environment by my words and actions? Do I take part in parish penance services to heal my wounds?*

### **Anointing of the Sick at Mass on Saturday February 11 at 5:30 pm and Sunday February 12 at 8:15 am.**

In recent years there has been a different emphasis on the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Even the change in the name of the Sacrament signals a new understanding. The old name, "Extreme Unction" often made the sacrament seem like a deathbed experience in preparation for the next life. The new name, "Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick" tries to convey the real purpose of the sacrament: to confer special grace on the Christian

experiencing the difficulties that accompany serious sickness or old age. In the past the sacrament was administered almost always in private (home or hospital). Although that is often still the case, parish celebrations of the sacrament have become common practice. This helps to underscore the fact that we are all involved in this sacramental action of Christ. It can also be a reminder to us that our sick brothers and sisters participate in a special way in the redemptive sufferings of Christ. As we were taught, every sacrament combines the action of Christ and the action of the community. We come together to pray, certainly for our sick and infirm brothers and sisters, but also for all those in our parish family in need of God's healing. [Copyright © 2010 Resource Publications, Inc. **Wilmington Diocese Sends 5 Delegates to Guatemala**  
On February 13, Mary Jo Frohlich and five delegates from the Wilmington Diocese will embark upon a week-long visitation to our sister diocese of San Marcos in Guatemala. The two dioceses have engaged in a solidarity partnership since 2003.

The agenda includes visitation with Bishop Alvaro Ramazzini and visits to El Quetzal and various communities where our Wilmington diocesan communities are partnered with various parishes, schools, medical clinics, and coffee plantations known as *fincas*. Delegate Mary Jo Frohlich says, "there is great interest in connecting directly with the people of San Marcos and in establishing and deepening friendships of solidarity."

**ADULT FAITH FORMATION**

**Taking it Home:** A woman had lost her husband and she was in terrible grief. She tries to do many things to get rid of her grief, but nothing worked. Someone convinced her that she should go see the spiritual master, which she eventually did. When she came to the master and told him of her loss and the pain she suffered, the master told the woman that he would love to help her but he was very cold. It was a chilly day and he had no wood for the fire. The master asked the woman if she could collect some wood then, he could address the woman's problem. The master said to the woman that there were

many nearby houses each with a generous household who would be sure to give her some wood. But, said the master, "only take wood from a household that had lost no one." And so the woman went to each house asking that, "if this house has lost no one, then please give me some wood." The woman came back to the master many hours later without any wood, but with her grief healed. (John Shea, "The Legend of the Bells & Other Tales").

Like this woman we all will at one time or another have similar feelings, feelings of deep pain and sadness and death; we cannot help but to fall prey to these feelings of grief. And as this grief grows deeper, we can drift into a sense of hopelessness and despair. At this point we can become like Job, despairing and angry with God. Is there really a God who cares about what happens to us? But just when all hope seems lost; just when our situation seems hopeless, we look around and see that we are not alone. There are others who have suffered as we have suffered and there is some comfort in that. The grieving woman learned this lesson. Her husband was lost and she was deeply hurting, but in her search for firewood, she discovered that she was not alone. There were many others who felt as she felt and in telling their common stories of pain and suffering, healing became possible. How do we know this truth?

Well, we don't always have a ready explanation. But what we do have is the story of Jesus. Instead of trying to tell us why we suffer, why there is pain and death, Jesus shows how to react to it. We are to approach those who suffer as he did by grasping their hands, helping them up, healing their broken hearts and binding up their wounds. Jesus shows us how to be in communion with our sisters and brothers, who share in our hurt and pain and through this communion we are able to bring healing and hope. Jesus provides us with a remedy that helps us to know how to handle the pain and hurt of this world.

**In light of this story of coming together in common communion to express our grief and sorrow over our losses, Resurrection Parish would like to begin a process for sharing such loss. On Tuesday, February 28, 2012 at 1 PM in room 4 and for every week thereafter Resurrection will begin this process of giving voice to such loss so that a time for healing may begin.
